

## Landhead Primary School Parent Questionnaire 2017



We had a 91% response rate for this year's questionnaire and are very grateful for the time people took to complete and return them.





Responses were categorised as positive if they were strongly agree and agree.

Questions with 100% positive response.

As a parent I feel welcome in Landhead Primary School.

The staff support the care, dignity and wellbeing of my child.

I am informed regularly by letter, school website, display, Facebook, email, text, etc. about the life and work of the school.

The school has informed me about how to report any concerns/complaints I may have.

The staff manage well the children's behaviour and deal effectively with related issues.

The school has informed me about how to report a safeguarding/child protection matter

Overall, I am happy with my child's experiences at Landhead.

My child is valued within school and their efforts and achievements are celebrated.

There is a culture of mutual respect between staff and pupils.

Children who need extra help are identified and well catered for.

The school building is kept clean and in good order.

Some issues that arose have been identified and are being worked on. These include:

All the areas where we had someone who disagreed.

In each case it was 1 person which equates to 2% of the responses.

- I receive helpful and regular information about planned learning activities for my child
  - This information is sent via the Newsletter and on our Facebook page and school website. Additional information may be gained by contacting your child's class teacher.
- The staff help my child develop his/her personal, social and emotional skills This is achieved through our NSPCC Keeping Safe programme and Helping Hands. We also use social games in classes, discussion activities and have a number of child committees in school, such as the School Council, SNAG and Rights Respecting. It is perhaps not always obvious how we develop these skills but they are a major factor in Landhead school life.
- The staff help my child to prepare of the future, in particular, for the next stage of their learning.
  - In Primary 7 we have been working with the post primary schools on a Transition project which is completed in the term prior to the children

leaving. We are always happy to talk through children's concerns when they are moving on - if we know about them. We want the transition to post primary to be as smooth and stress free as possible for the children.

• The staff ask for my views and take my views into account.

During both parent interviews parents should take the opportunity to let the teacher know their views. We are more than willing at any other time for parents to speak to us about any matter regarding their child and we will take these in to account.

At other times we send questionnaire or ask parents opinions when we can.

• If my child feels unwell or unhappy in school the staff deal with it effectively.

There are at least 2 members of staff in each classroom and at least 2 on each break or lunch time. If we see children in physical or mental distress we try to deal with this in a sympathetic and caring manner. We cannot help when the child does not tell us. Please encourage your child to let us know when they are unwell or unhappy.

If a child needs intervention with a cut or graze or bump to the head we do try to inform the parent if at all possible. In certain circumstances we may contact the emergency number to have the child taken to get checked out. Minor falls we do not let parents know as children are mostly up and running immediately.

• I have been informed about the school's policy in acceptable use of the internet.

<u>ALL</u> parents and pupils are given this when they are about to enter *Primary 1*.

However we will put a copy in the parent's area of the school website with the policies.

Any other policies parents may want added please let us know.

We will be adding an up to date Complaints Policy after the next Board of Governors meeting.

- Meetings with teachers and parents are helpful and informative Please feel free to bring notes in to parents meetings and make sure you ask anything specific that you have concerns about. Sometimes we don't know what it is we have not brought to your attention that you may want please let the teacher know at interview or make an appointment and speak to them at any other time.
- There were a few responses 'don't know' -

This is discussed with children in the last term of Primary 7.


- Great school.
